

Lamps with Triangular Beak and Volutes in Roman Dacia

(Summary)

In Roman Dacia lamps with triangular beak and volutes were discovered in few settlements. Most of them are imports from North-Italian workshops. The production of such lamps is attested at Ulpia Traiana Sarmizegetusa (the workshop was identified by the execution and the large number of pieces) and Porolissum (the lower part of a mould proves a local production). Chronologically the lamps with a triangular beak and volutes are known in the first half of the II century AD.
