

RELAȚIILE COMERCIALE ALE ANTICULUI TIBISCUM CU PROVINCIIILE IMPERIULUI ROMAN (II). AMFORELE

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***Abstract:** With the use of a typological catalogue of Roman Amphorae we can assert that in the Military Vicus from Tibiscum we have a strong commercial relation with Iberian Peninsula, especially in the 2nd and 3rd Century A. D. Italian amphoras were not a primary choice in the same historical period accordingly to our catalogue. The numbers of Hispanic amphoras were all the time the largest ones.*

We can not observe any preferences connected to the type of amphora, the primary interest, in roman time, was the transported product and we can distinguish olives (1 amphora), olive oil (2), wine (7) and garum and other fish products (5) the rest of amphorae were not yet identified in the transported product. Interestingly, only from Iberian Peninsula fish, garum and other related product were imported, never from the eastern provinces. From Hispania and Italia wine and olive oil was imported mostly in the 2nd Century A. D. and from eastern provices (Egeean and Pontic) in the 3rd Century A. D.
